Tim Cassidy is the associate athletic director for football at Texas A&M University. In addition to working with the football staff and assisting in recruiting efforts, Mr. Cassidy is responsible for many other aspects of running a Division I football program.

Cassidy coordinates travel, budget and staffing for the football office, assists with scheduling and oversees the compliance, strength and conditioning, equipment and academic support units regarding football and he supervises the football support staffs.



Tim Cassidy has over 25 years of experience working in collegiate football, 19 of those years spent with Texas A&M. Cassidy came to A&M from Morningside College where he was an assistant football coach from 1981-83. He joined Jackie Sherrill's Texas A&M staff as a graduate assistant in recruiting in 1983-84 and was promoted to recruiting coordinator in 1985-86. He left A&M to serve as the director of recruiting at the University of Florida in 1987 and 1988. He returned to Aggieland to serve on R.C. Slocum's first Aggie staff as recruiting coordinator from 1989-91. He was promoted to assistant athletic director for recruiting in 1991. In 2003, Bill Byrne and head football coach Dennis Franchione promoted Cassidy to associate athletic director for football at Texas A&M until Cassidy left for Nebraska in January of 2004. On November 30, 2007, Tim Cassidy was brought back as the Associate Athletic Director for football at Texas A&M by head football coach Mike Sherman.



Cassidy was instrumental in the planning of the Tom and Nancy Osborn Athletic Complex that houses the Husker football team, training and weight rooms, coaches' offices, and administrative offices. He was also involved in the planning of the Texas A&M Bright Football Complex and the Nye Academic Center.
